

HOW TO GET YOUR ITALIAN UNIVOCAL ID NUMBER

The Codice Fiscale (Italian Tax Code) is a personal code (combination of numbers and letters) which identifies each individual person in Italy when dealing with public offices and/or administration. For example, you may need it in case you want to open a bank account in Italy, sign a rental contract, etc.

It is strongly recommended to request “codice fiscale” applying for it to Italian consular authorities in the Country of residence. For the specific modalities please visit the website of the competent consular office.

In any other situation, “codice fiscale” can be obtained from the offices of the Italian Revenue Agency, by submitting the form AA4/8 indicating the personal data and the residence for tax purposes.

Students from non-EU Countries must submit at least one of the following documents:

- a valid passport with visa (if required)
- a certificate of identity issued by the Italian diplomatic or consular authorities of the Country of nationality (with photo)
- a valid permit of stay (permesso di soggiorno) or receipt of the post office application
- an ID card issued by the municipality of residence in Italy.

Students of European Union must show, along with the form for the assignment, a valid identification document (identity card or passport).
