PLOT

Aaron Eckhart portrays tobacco lobbyist Nick Naylor who is also vice president of the Academy for Tobacco Studies in Washington D.C. Talking is his forte and his winning concept is to never lose an argument.

His opponent, a Vermont senator (played by William Macy) is insistent upon proving him wrong to further his own notoriety.

Robert Duval (the captain) appears as the founder of the Academy for Tobacco Studies and takes a keen interest in Nick as does Katie Holmes (Heather Holloway) a young Washington press reporter who will let nothing stand in her way of obtaining a good story.

Nick's son Joey, played by young Cameron Bright, contributes to the most challenging decisions Nick is faced with.
