He then aspires to a higher calling. ## IMPERATIVE

There is no special form of the verb for the imperative in English. For example:

- Instructions:
   Mix the flour and the sugar
   Take two tablets every four hours
   Take the second turning on the left
- Invitations:
   Come in, make yourselves at home Please start, don't wait for me
- Orders (telling someone what to do): Open your books, turn to page 5 and look at the first picture Hurry up! It's twenty past seven Don't forget to post that letter! Don't be late!

- Signs and notices: *Push Insert* 2x50p *Keep off* the grass

VOCABULARY	
<b>Nightmare:</b> a dream that can cause a strong emotional response from the mind, typically fear or horror, but also despair, anxiety and great sadness	Apathy: lack of interest, enthusiasm or concern
<b>Evil:</b> profound immorality and wickedness, especially when regarded as a supernatural force	<b>Prey:</b> one that is defenseless, especially in the face of attack; a victim
<b>Petty:</b> relating to things that are not very important or serious; committing crimes that are not very serious	To be spared: to refrain from harming or destroying
<b>Fearful:</b> causing or capable of causing fear; frightening (ex. <i>a fearful howling</i> )	To take back: to bring back to the point of departure
<b>Guilt:</b> an emotion that occurs when a person believes that they have violated a moral standard that they themselves believe in	To cloud: to obscure
<b>Anger:</b> a strong feeling of displeasure and belligerence aroused by a wrong	To be afraid: filled with fear or apprehension
<b>Deception:</b> beguilement, deceit, bluff, mystification and subterfuge	To mind: to be distressed, annoyed, or worried by
Rage: a vehement desire or passion	<b>To distort:</b> to change the natural, normal, or original shape or appearance of something in a way that is usually not attractive or pleasing
<b>Fault:</b> an unattractive or unsatisfactory feature, especially in a piece of work or in a person's character	<b>Unforgivable:</b> so bad as to be unable to be forgiven or excused
<b>Yield:</b> give way to arguments, demands, or pressure	Appalling: horrifying; shocking
Thrill: a sudden feeling of excitement and pleasure	Scary: frightening; causing fear
<b>X-ray:</b> an electromagnetic wave of high energy and very short wavelength (between ultraviolet light and gamma rays), which is able to pass through many materials opaque to light	Finder's keeper's: used to assert that whoever finds something by chance is entitled to keep it
Ninja: a member of a class of 14th-century Japanese mercenary agents who were trained in the martial arts and hired for covert operations	To bury: to put in the ground and cover with earth
