PLOT

The rebellious Miguel, a 12-year-old Mexican boy and hopeful musician, is unable to understand the family's continuing ban on all music, especially when the greatest guitar played the deceased Ernesto de la Cruz, the town's hero. However, a careless mistake on the sacred Day of the Dead will magically transport Miguel to the distant and busily Land of the Dead, where the charming trickster, Hector, will lead the way through the vibrant underworld to help the young trespasser find a missing ancestor. Can they do it before sunrise?

The film shows approval due for its animation, voice music, emotional story, and respect for Mexican culture. It grossed over \$807 million becoming the 15th highest-grossing animated film ever and was the 11th highest-grossing film of 2017. The film won Best Animated Film at the BAFTA Awards, Golden Globe Awards, and Critic's Choice Movie Awards.

GRAMMAR

INVERSION

In a formal style, or for emphasis, words with a negative or restrictive force are placed at the BEGINNING of a sentence.

These include:

- Hardly, scarcely, seldom
- Little, only
- Never, not until, no sooner, rarely
- Under no circumstances, on no account



When these expressions begin a sentence, the normal order of subject and the auxiliary is REVERSED.

Hardly HAD I STARTED my exam, when the ceiling collapsed! No sooner DID HE open the door than the cat attacked him. Under no circumstances WILL the president RESIGN.

To be scared: to be afraid of someone/ something	When life gets me down: it becomes hard to feel motivated or excited about anything	
To banish: to exile someone, send them away from the country where they live & not allow them to return	To borrow: get something from someone intending to give it back after a short time
